



Child Find Pre-K Screening Schedule

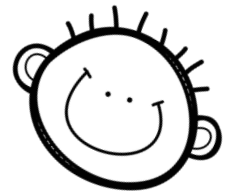
Sponsored by Calhoun Co. Schools, Liberty Co. Schools, and FDLRS PAEC

This school year, Calhoun and Liberty County Schools will be sponsoring joint Pre-K Screening events that will be held in Blountstown and Bristol; families may attend either location. Parent/Guardian must provide permission for child to participate.

Children ages 3—5 years are invited to participate in a developmental screening (no cost to family) to check speech/communication, learning, motor, and social skills. With parent/guardian permission, any child in need of further evaluation will be referred to the school district of residence. Eligible children may receive therapy and/or pre-k ESE classroom services. Helpful documents to bring to screening include the child’s birth certificate and private therapy evaluation reports (if child receives therapy currently).
