

The School Board shall establish residential attendance zones for each school. All students, unless otherwise provided by School Board rule or authorized by the School Board's order, shall attend the school serving the student's residential attendance zone. A student's residence is the residence of his/her parent(s), as defined by Florida Statutes or the court's designee by order of the court. Any student residing in the School District shall be assigned to a school for attendance by the Superintendent or designee.

- I. No student shall be permitted to transfer, enroll, or be admitted to a school when he/she has been expelled or suspended from another school district. This prohibition shall be effective for the period of time in which the student was expelled or suspended from another district. Such students shall be accorded the same appeals procedure which is available to District students.
- II. A student may be permitted to attend a school in another residential attendance zone pursuant to the *Controlled Open Enrollment Plan* adopted by the School Board.
- III. A student enrolled in any school in Calhoun County may not transfer to another school in the county during the semester for which he/she is enrolled, unless his/her parents or guardians move into the attendance area of the other school. The parent/guardian enrolling the student will be required to furnish two forms of proper documentation to establish proof of residency.
- IV. Any student whose legal residence is outside the boundaries of the county may be enrolled in a District school under the provisions of Florida Statutes and the *Controlled Open Enrollment Plan*. The assigned school for an out-of-district student shall be designated on the basis of space available. Such transfers shall be on a nondiscriminatory basis and shall not result in reducing desegregation in either school district or in reinforcing the dual school system.
- V. A student who has been attending, in the year prior to the designation, a public school that has been classified as performance grade category "F" or has earned three (3) consecutive grades of "D" or a student who is assigned to a public school that has been designated as performance grade category "F" or has earned three (3) consecutive grades of "D" may attend a higher performing public school in the District or a school in another district as allowed by law.
- VI. Based upon recommendation of the student placement committee, the Superintendent may assign any student to an alternative site anytime during the school year when such placement is deemed to be in the best interest of the student.
