Priority 1:

1. All 3rd grade students who are Free/Reduce Priced Lunch (FRPL) applicants who scored 50^{%tile} or below on SAT 10 Reading or Math or students who are repeating 3rd grade.
2. All 4th or 5th grade students who are FRPL applicants who scored Level 2 or below on FCAT Reading or Math.

Priority 2:

1. All 3rd grade students who are FRPL applicants who scored 35thtile or below on SAT 10 Reading or Math.

2. All 4th or 5th grade students who are FRPL applicants who scored Level 3 on FCAT Reading or Math.

Priority 3:

2. All 2nd or 1st grade students who are FRPL applicants who have a probability of reading success score of high risk on FAIR.

4. All Kindergarten students who are FRPL applicants who are repeating kindergarten.
